Baking & Preserves

Section 5000 Adult Baking

All entries must be prepared by the exhibitor with original ingredients. No commercial mixes can be used. Entries must not need to be refrigerated (no custard or meat products).

Entries should be displayed on a white plate (can be paper) in a clear plastic bag (ziploc or twist tie) with entry tags attached to the plastic bag.

Include the variety (ie. Chocolate Chip Cookies, Carrot Cake).

Exhibitors can enter a maximum of two (2) entries per class provided different recipes are used.

Definitions

Drop Cookies: A relatively soft dough is dropped by the spoonful onto the baking sheet. During baking, the mounds of dough spread and flatten.

Rolled Cookies: Made from a stiffer dough that is chilled and then rolled out and cut into shapes with a cookie cutter, knife or pastry wheel.

Molded Cookies: Made from a stiffer dough that is molded into balls or other shapes before baking.

Cut Flowers, Floral Arrangements, Potted Plants, & Produce

Section 7000 Adult Cut Flowers

Unless otherwise specified, all entries are to be displayed with foil over a shallow container, 1 colour, no foliage. Narrow necked vases should be used for "in vase" entries.

Exhibitors are responsible for filling containers with water. Access to water will be available on site during move in.

Exhibitors can enter a maximum of two (2) entries per class provided different varieties are entered. Please indicate the variety.

All flowers must have been grown by the exhibitor, in Alberta, north of Red Deer.
