

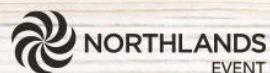

# — MAKERS EXHIBITION —

## Entry Fees & Registration

Entry registration can be completed online at <https://k-days.com/indoor/makers-exhibition/> starting in May. A maximum of 5 additional entries per exhibitor from pre-registered exhibitors can be added on site during Move In. Entry fees paid during move in must be paid in cash. Entry fees are non-refundable but can be transferred to an entry in a different class or to an individual in the same household.

Entry Fees: \$1.00 per entry  
 Youth Classes: Free  
 Exhibitor Registration Fee: \$10.00 (one per exhibitor) \*

### \* Includes one complimentary K-Days General Admission One Day Pass

Each exhibitor will receive an entry receipt and grounds map/directions via email. Entry receipts must be presented upon arrival during designated move in/move out times to gain access to the grounds. K-Days Passes will be distributed upon check in of exhibits and can be used any one day of K-Days 2020.

# – MAKERS EXHIBITION –

## Prizes & Results

The K-Days Makers Exhibition shall use the Fair System of Judging. Only one 1st, 2nd, & 3rd place ribbon shall be awarded in each class. No ribbon will be awarded if the items in a class fail to meet a reasonable level of achievement & officials reserve the right to not display entries that fail to meet a certain level of achievement.

First Place	\$6	Red Ribbon	3 points	* All youth entries will also receive a participation ribbon*
Second Place	\$4	Blue Ribbon	2 points	
Third Place	\$2	White Ribbon	1 point	

<b>Adult Best of Section-</b> Photography, Painting & Drawing, Hobbies & Crafts, Thread Art, Baking, Preserves, Flowers & Plants, and Produce	8 x \$100 prizes
<b>Youth Best of Section-</b> Photography x 2, Painting & Drawing x 3, Hobbies & Crafts x 3, Foods x 3, and Horticulture x 3	14 x \$50 prizes
<b>Division Aggregates-</b> Art, Foods, & Horticulture	3 x \$250 prizes
<b>Youth Aggregates-</b> Primary, Elementary, & Junior	3 x \$100 prizes
<b>Major Aggregates-</b> Overall & Family	2 x \$500 prizes

**Best of Section-** the top entries in each class of an adult section will be judged against each other to determine the “Best of Section”.

**Best of Section Youth-** the top entries in each class of a youth section will be judged against each other to determine the “Best of Section” for each age category – Primary, Elementary, and Junior.

**Division Aggregates-** exhibitors will receive points as outlined in the table above for each placing awarded to them. The exhibitor with the highest number of points in each division- Art, Food, & Horticulture- will be awarded the Division Aggregate Prize. Only points awarded in adult classes will be used.

**Youth Aggregates-** youth exhibitors will receive points as outlined in the table above for each placing awarded to them. The exhibitor with the highest number of points in each age category- Primary, Elementary, and Junior- will be awarded the Youth Aggregate Prize. Only points awarded in youth classes will be used in calculation for these prizes.

**Family Aggregate-** awarded to the family with the highest number of points (cumulative total from all members of the same household). Families must register during check in to be eligible for this award. Cheque will be issued to the individual with the highest number of points.

**Overall Aggregate-** awarded to the individual with the highest number of total points across all adult divisions. Only points awarded in adult classes will be used in calculations for this prize.

In the event of a tie for an aggregate prize, the exhibitor with the highest number of 1<sup>st</sup> place entries will be deemed to be the winner. Art Results will be posted online by July 17 and Foods & Horticulture Results will be posted online by July 25. Prize money less than \$20 will be paid in cash during move out. If an exhibitor does not pick up their prize money (under \$20) by 7 pm on July 27, it will be donated to agriculture education initiatives. Cheques will be issued for prize money \$20 and over and mailed out by September 15. Cheques not cashed by October 31 will be cancelled with funds considered a donation to agricultural education initiatives.

# — MAKERS EXHIBITION —

## General Rules

Please read directions carefully for each section and class (regarding dimensions, size, quantity of items required, etc). Failure to follow directions may result in the item being disqualified. **Exhibitors must notify the organizers of any entries exceeding 18" x 24" dimensions to ensure sufficient space.**

The K-Days Makers Exhibition is for amateur enthusiasts to portray their work. Exhibitors are restricted to individuals who earn less than 50% of their income from their endeavors.

Exhibitors may reside anywhere, not just in Edmonton. Unless otherwise noted, produce and cut flower entries must be grown in Alberta, north of Red Deer.

All exhibitors **MUST** be the bona fide maker or grower of their exhibits. The use of commercially produced or grown products will result in the forfeiture of ALL prizes won by exhibitor.

Only Judges and designated exhibition officials are allowed in the Exhibit Area during Judging. Judges will be selected from a pool of qualified individuals as determined by Northlands with input from the appropriate professional organization.

All entries must arrive during the move in time noted. Organizers reserve the right to refuse entries that arrive after the designated time. Entries must be removed during the designated move out time. Entries not picked up during this time become the property of Northlands. Removal of entries by the exhibitor prior to the designated move out time will result in the forfeiture of all prize monies.

Youth entries will be divided into 3 separate sections: Primary (8 years old and younger), Elementary (9 to 12 years old), and Junior (13 to 17 years old). All ages are as of the first day of K-Days.

Youth are welcome to compete in any adult section, provided they exhibit a unique entry in each class. (ie. a single recipe cannot be used in multiple categories, the same photograph cannot be entered twice)

All entries must have official exhibition tags attached. Tags will be available during Move In.

Unless otherwise specified, exhibitors may submit a maximum of two (2) entries per class, provided each entry is unique. Exhibits are to be entered under only one name

Entries containing scenes of violence, nudity, or sexually suggestive content will not be accepted.

All exhibits must have been made within the past two years and not previously been entered in the K-Days Makers Exhibition. Exceptions apply to houseplants only.

Organizers reserve the right to combine classes due to insufficient entries or divide classes with extensive entries into multiple classes. Organizers may also move an entry if it better fits in another class.

Interpretation of all rules shall be made by exhibition officials, whose decision shall be final. Should any question arise not provided for in the Rules and Regulations, the decision of the exhibition officials shall be final. The right to alter, interpret, amend, add to or cancel any of these rules, or to grant relaxation from them in individual cases is reserved to the exhibition officials.

All properties of exhibitors entered for competition shall be subject to control of the organizers, but in no case shall Northlands be held responsible for any loss, damage or injury of any nature to any such property while in Northlands possession. Organizers will take reasonable precautions to ensure the safety of articles, but property owners should make their own arrangements for coverage against loss, damage or injury.

All classes are for colour photographs unless otherwise indicated. A photograph cannot be entered in more than one class.

## FOODS DIVISION

### *Baking & Preserves*

#### Section 5000 Adult Baking

All entries must be prepared by the exhibitor with original ingredients. No commercial mixes can be used. Entries must not need to be refrigerated (no custard or meat products).

Entries should be displayed on a white plate (can be paper) in a clear plastic bag (ziploc or twist tie) with entry tags attached to the plastic bag.

Include the variety (ie. Chocolate Chip Cookies, Carrot Cake).

Exhibitors can enter a maximum of two (2) entries per class provided different recipes are used.

#### *Definitions*

*Drop Cookies: A relatively soft dough is dropped by the spoonful onto the baking sheet. During baking, the mounds of dough spread and flatten.*

*Rolled Cookies: Made from a stiffer dough that is chilled and then rolled out and cut into shapes with a cookie cutter, knife or pastry wheel.*

*Molded Cookies: Made from a stiffer dough that is molded into balls or other shapes before baking.*

## Section 5100 Primary Foods

All entries must be prepared by the exhibitor with original ingredients. No commercial mixes can be used.

Baking entries should be displayed on a white plate (can be paper) in a clear plastic bag (ziploc or twist tie) with entry tags attached to the plastic bag.

Include the variety (ie. Chocolate Chip Cookies, Rice Krispie Squares). Exhibitors can enter a maximum of two (2) entries per class provided different recipes are used.

- 5101. Cookies, any type, 3
- 5102. Muffins, any type, 3
- 5103. Brownies or Baked Squares, 3
- 5104. Unbaked Squares, 3
- 5105. Box Lunch- a typical balanced school lunch on display in a lunch bag or box. Include an index card with a list of items and food group. Drink containers/thermos can be empty.
- 5106. Trail Mix, 500g in clear sealed container or jar

## Section 5200 Elementary Foods

All entries must be prepared by the exhibitor with original ingredients. No commercial mixes can be used.

Baking entries should be displayed on a white plate (can be paper) in a clear plastic bag (ziploc or twist tie) with entry tags attached to the plastic bag.

Include the variety (ie. Chocolate Chip Cookies, Carrot Cake).
